Right after registrants click on the online form's Submit button (www.ValleyDisasterFair.com) beginning July 1, we email them a *Welcome to the Fair* letter. A section of that email includes a paragraph of about 150-200 words that your NC wishes to present to its stakeholders and will include an NC contact name and email provided by your Council, so they can request more information, etc. Don't miss this chance to connect to **your stakeholders**. Email your paragraph **TODAY!**

Panorama City Neighborhood Council (PCNC), made up of local volunteers, wants to help keep you safe by supporting our community's emergency preparation, increasing public safety, and doing as much as it can to help the community.

Come and participate in direct democracy and make your voice be heard! If you are interested in the future of Panorama City, PCNC needs YOU! There are many ways to get involved in our Council, and you can come to any of our meetings to share your perspective and/or be a part of any standing committee. Our current standing committees are focused on land use, city life, public safety, mobility (including buses and bicycling), commerce and education. The Panorama City Neighborhood Council Board meets on the fourth Thursday of every month (3rd in Nov & Dec) and most of our committees also meet around once per month.

The Bel Air-Beverly Crest Neighborhood Council (named for our Community Plan) represents the City of Los Angeles hillside communities stretching from Laurel Canyon Boulevard to Sepulveda Boulevard and from Sunset Boulevard to Mulholland Drive. The BABCNC advocates for more than 27,000 residents, and is comprised of representatives from more than 30 residential associations, local schools, businesses, and faith based institutions, in addition to members at large. BABCNC promotes citizen participation in local government and advises and integrates with all of the departments and city officials of Los Angeles to foster greater understanding and responds to the needs and requests of our neighborhoods, residents, and diverse stakeholders.

Our Disaster Preparedness Committee considers all issues pertaining to the police and fire departments, as well as educating area residents as to how to proceed in the event of an emergency or catastrophic event, or if there is need for emergency medical services.
